The National Picture

- The whole of the UK has now returned to pre-pandemic approaches to grading and GCSE results reflect this. Comparisons are made to 2023 and not before.
- This year's results mark the biggest ever assessment series in England, Northern Ireland and Wales for GCSE entries, mostly made up of an increase in 16-yearolds.
- GCSE overall results for 16-year-olds are broadly similar to 2023:
 - At 7/A and above: 22.0% (2023) and 21.8% (2024)
 - At 4/C and above: 68.2% (2023) and 67.6% (2024)
